# Historical Facts

The first recorded shipment of wheat from the prairies occurred in 1876 when R.C. Steele of Toronto travelled to Winnipeg to purchase seed wheat. Although he needed 5000 bushels, he was able to purchase only 857. His purchase was sacked and shipped through a circuitous route south from Winnipeg by steamer on the Red River to Fisher's Landing in Minnesota, where it was taken by rail to Duluth, by boat to Samia and finally by rail to Toronto.
