The 3-day long event ran from August 11<sup>th</sup> to August 13<sup>th</sup> from 9 am to 4 pm at the Stettler Museum. It featured over 100 antique tractors and pieces of farm equipment, displays, and live demos. We were celebrating 120 years of John Deere in the Stettler area!
